



Flying Geese - 4 at a time

Use this cutting chart to stitch oversized Flying Geese, 4-at-a-time and then trim them down to the perfect size. Works with either standard rotary or specialty rulers like the Wing Clipper.

You will need this measurement **ONLY if you trim with your standard rotary cutting ruler. It is the vertical center of your Flying Geese units. You won't need it if you use a specialty ruler like the Wing Clipper.
